- Achieving compliance for the school's registration for the next 5 years. NSW Education Standard Authority (NESA) inspected Al Hikma College and gave us the report which stated that the school is compliant with all the requirements for the registration. CONGRATULATIONS!!!
- Getting school grant of \$25,000 for refurbishing the shade area
- Purchased another property which is located on Quigg Street. We have intention to start High School in the near future.
- Conducting two separate camps at Ulladulla which is owned by the school. Al Hikma College is the first Muslim school in Australia to have its own massive, luxurious, self-contained camp site which can cater for over sixty students. Life skills activities at the camp promoted discipline, self-reliance, confidence, communication, and collaboration. It taught organisational skills and promoted friendships through team building sports allowing even those students to connect who otherwise tend to be introverts.
- Special well-being camp was organised for Al Hikma Staff which also included PD on discipline policy and strategies to curb disciplinary issues at Al Hikma College.
- Producing great result in NAPLAN. Al Hikma College is again proud of the achievement of all our students who performed very well in most aspects of literacy and numeracy.
- Continue running Quran Hafiz classes which has close to forty members who intend to memorise the Quran by heart. The online lessons will continue in the holidays
- Participated in various sporting events which include OZ Tag, soccer, Newcomb Ball, Basketball, Cricket, Athletic Carnival, Cross- Country Carnival (at the camp), Swimming and Badminton
- Fundraised for the poor and needy throughout the Year
- Visited and made dua for the sick people at the hospital

The school also had amazing accomplishments in Science Fair, Literacy Week and Numeracy Week. Time flies when we are having fun and this year was no exception. Congratulations to everyone for their effort, teamwork, and dedication. I wish all you a restful and enjoyable break.

I have noticed that a lot of parents have got into the habit of taking extended leaves for traveling overseas during school the hours. This causes major disruption to the studies and affects the performance of the students. To curb this, we would prefer the parents to arrange their traveling at the end of Term 3 which has been extended for 3 weeks or during the school holidays.

REPORTS

The 2023 Semester 2 Student Reports are currently being written. Teachers have been busy assessing your child's progress. These are due to be emailed in the final week of the school which falls on Friday 15th December.

LOST AND FOUND PROPERTY

Some jackets, jumpers, blazers, lunch boxes and water bottles need to be identified and collected by the parents/students before the end of this term. Please retrieve them before it is recycled. Lost items are currently on the display in the small playground. Please be reminded that all items that the students bring to school are to be clearly labelled.

STUDENT PICK UP & DROP OFF TIMES

Drop off times will be unchanged; however, we urge all parents to not get out of the car when dropping off their child and refrain from congregating on school grounds. Parents need to leave immediately after dropping off their child.

Pick up times, however, have changed slightly:

2:55pm – 3:05pm: K to 2 with no siblings in older grades.

3:15 – 3:20pm : Years 3 to 4 students with no siblings in older grades.

3:20pm – 3:30pm: Years 5 to 6 students with younger siblings.

It is vital that parents strictly pick up their child in the allocated times to avoid unnecessary congestion

NOTE:

An important reminder to all our families during drop offs and pickups: Please ensure that you always remain in your car (do not park your car and leave it unattended), be aware of the children who are also using the driveway and abide by the 5km/hr speed limit. Safety is a priority.

All three gates will open at 3:00pm, if your child is in K-4 and you prefer to pick them up from the back gate, please inform the class teacher in advance. This will help avoid unnecessary gatherings and potential chaos during the peak traffic hours.

STUDENT EXIT

It has come to our notice that some parents would pull their child out of school without notice. If you intend to withdraw your child for home schooling or otherwise, please fill in the withdrawal form so that we could formally release the child from the school. This will enable us to take your child's name out of the Sentral and Dojo as well.

(Key word: wait. This process may take time, but we've learnt that with practice comes improvement).



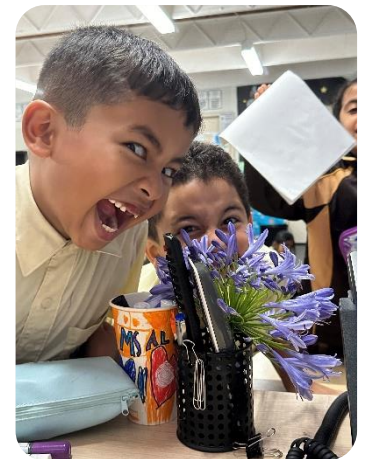
Your curiosity and eagerness to learn has made every day a joy in our

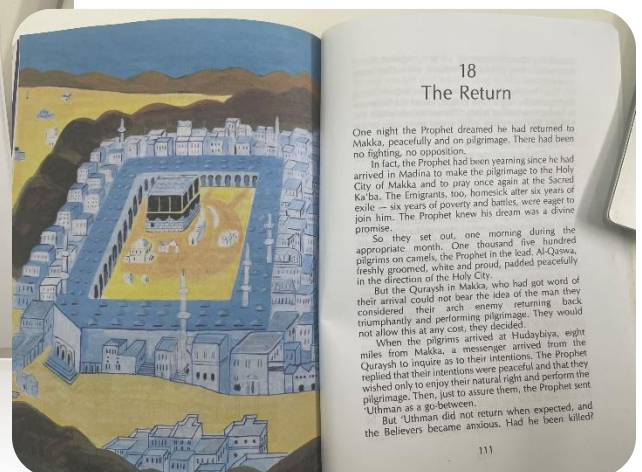
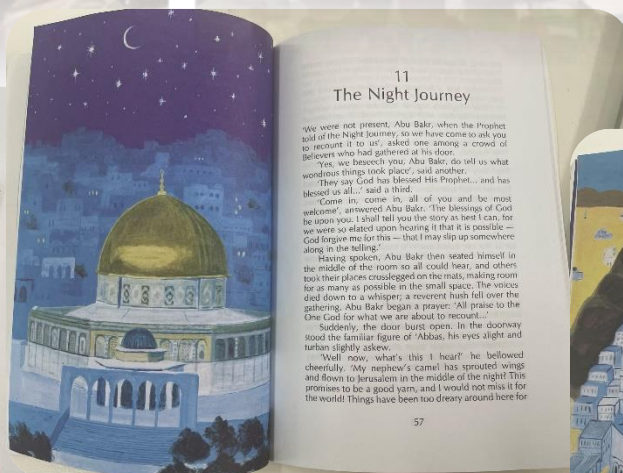
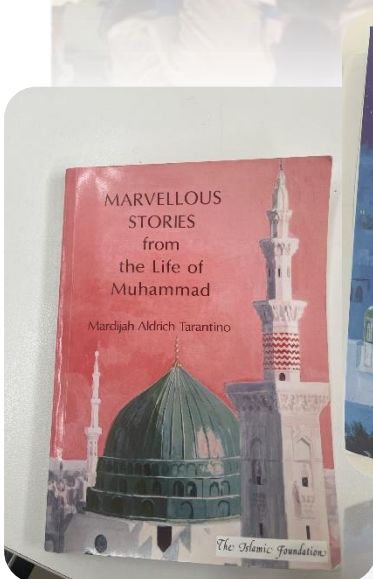


Asalam alaykum dear parents,

3B have had a wonderful year and have made steady progress academically and socially.

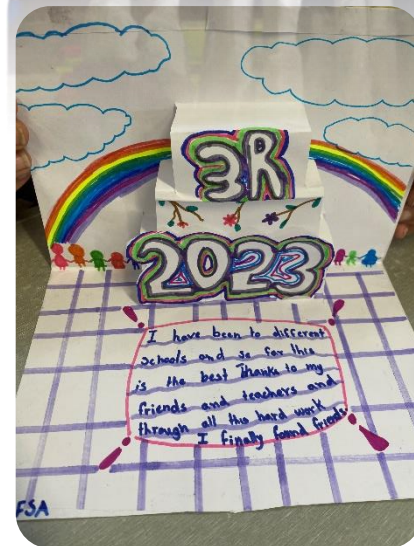
