ATTENDANCE & UNIFORM

All students are expected to be at school no earlier than 8:10 am and no later than 8:30am. Students need to be present for the morning Halaqa. Students who arrive after 8:45am are deemed as late arrivals. They must get their late note from the office prior to going to their classes. Students who are late regularly or have excessive unjustified absences may jeopardise their enrolment at the college.

Extended leave will only be granted for exceptional circumstances, as it causes major distractions to a student's learning routine. Leave forms must be submitted at least 4 weeks prior to leave date.

Students are expected to always be in full school uniform. All students are required to be wearing black leather shoes except on sport days or if instructed otherwise. Hats must always be worn during sport, recess and lunch times.

Students are not allowed to have step cuts or very long hair. Students will be given a warning if their haircut is unacceptable. If the haircut is not rectified by parents, students will be sent home until changes have been applied.

STUDENT PICK UP & DROP OFF TIMES

Drop off times will be unchanged; however, we urge all parents to not get out of the car when dropping off their children and refrain from congregating on school grounds. Parents need to leave immediately after dropping off their child.

Pick up times, however, have changed slightly:

3:00pm – 3:10pm: Kindy and year one students with no siblings in older grades.

3:10 – 3:20pm: Year 2 and year 3 students with no siblings in older grades.

3:20pm – 3:30pm: Years 4 to 6 students with younger siblings.

It is vital that parents strictly pick up their children in the allocated times to avoid unnecessary congestion.

NOTE:

An important reminder to all our families during drop offs and pickups: Please ensure that you always remain in your car (do not park your car and leave it unattended), be aware of the children who are also using the driveway and abide by the 5km/hr speed limit. Safety is a priority.

All three gates will open at 3:00pm, if your child is in K-4 and you prefer to pick them up from the back gate (Quigg Street), please inform the class teacher in advance. This will help avoid unnecessary gatherings and potential exposure.

NAPLAN NEWS

Students in Year 3 and 5 will participate in NAPLAN online this year from March 15 - 27 March. Year 3 complete Reading, Language Conventions and Mathematics online. Year 3 complete writing with pen and paper. Year 5 complete Writing, Reading, Language Conventions and Mathematics online. All students are required to use headphones during the test so they can hear verbal instructions without disrupting other students. All students in Year 3 and 5 will need to send a pair of headphones to the school before Term 1, Week 6, 2023 to ensure all students are ready to participate in the NAPLAN test window. The following frequently asked questions answer some important information regarding NAPLAN.
